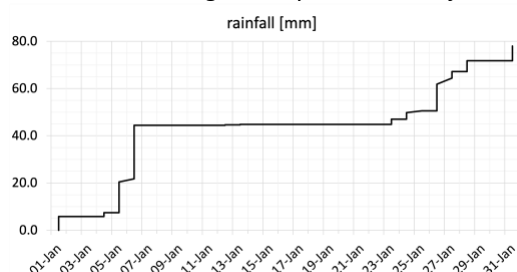
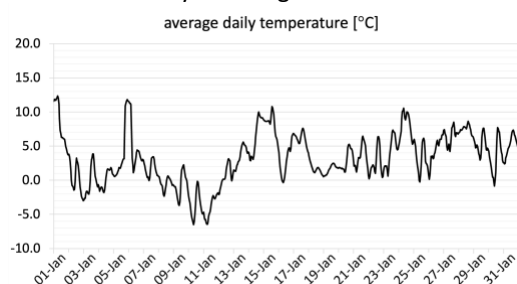


OffWeather – January 2025

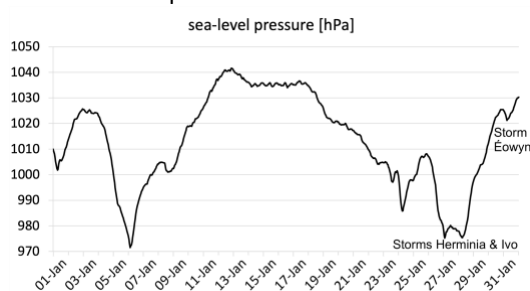
An above average month for rainfall with 78.0mm, which is 136% of the average for January in our area. Nearly half of the month's total fell over the 5th and 6th. That was followed by a very dry period of 16 days up to the 23rd with just 0.4 mm recorded, and that only due to condensation from morning mists and fog. There were 18 days in total with no measurable rainfall but five snow days, i.e. snow is seen falling in a day – even if it's just a single flake!



It was a relatively cool month, with the average temperature being 3.2°C, which is 1.7°C below the area's average and 1.4°C below that of last January. There were 12 air frost(s) and 17 ground frost(s). The month's highest temperature was 12.4°C, which occurred on New Year's Day and the lowest was -6.7°C in the early morning of the 11th.



Storms *Herminia* on the 27th and *Ivo* on the 29th plus storm *Éowyn* on the 31st caused blustery winds, mainly southwesterlies. However, the highest winds during January occurred on New Year's Day when a gust of 41 mph was recorded in Offchurch. The atmospheric pressure averaged 1014 hPa. The maximum pressure was 1042 hPa with a minimum of a very low 972 hPa.



A slightly dull month with 54 sunshine hours, which is 14 percent below average and 12 fewer hours than last year. There were 14 days when no sunshine at all was detected.
