

OffWeather - February 2025


This February did not live up to its name of 'fill-dyke' as was the case last year. The total rainfall was 44.4 mm, which is 99.2 percent of the average of 45.2 mm for this area and 100 mm less than in 2024, which most certainly did fill the dykes! There were actually 14 days with no measurable rainfall, and as may be seen from the chart, most of the rainfall was in the second half of the month. The 15th and 23rd were both very wet days. There were no days of lying snow.




Mild day-time temperatures gave an average temperature of 5.1°C, which is 0.2°C above the month's average. There were nine overnight air frosts and 13 ground frosts. The warmest day was the 21st, with 15.7°C and the coldest night was the 6th with minus 4°C.



Winds were generally from an easterly direction until the 19th, when they turned towards the south. Mostly quiet until the change in direction, their strength grew with a maximum gust of 34 mph on the 21st. The atmospheric pressure was relatively high throughout and averaged 1022 hPa. The maximum pressure was 1044 hPa, with a minimum of 1007 hPa.



Given that it seemed a dull month there were actually 80 hours of sunshine, which is 2 percent above the average for February. There were eight cloudy days with no sunshine recorded and an additional five days with less than an hour of sunshine per day.
