

## OffWeather - March 2025


March turned out to be a dry month with just 19 mm of rain, most of which fell in the period of the 22nd – 23rd, as shown in the accompanying chart. Actually, March is not a particularly wet month in our area and this month's total represents 42 percent of the average rainfall. However, it was the fourth driest March since 1998, when our records began. There were 24 days without any rainfall and no snow days.




The average temperature was 7.9°C, which is 0.6°C above the area's average and 0.7°C above that of last March. There were 9 air frost(s) and 11 ground frost(s). The 20th & 31st had the highest temperatures for this March of 19.9°C.



Winds were light to moderate, mainly easterly with a maximum gust of 24 mph on the 29th. The atmospheric pressure averaged 1018 hPa. The maximum pressure was 1036 hPa with a minimum of 1001 hPa. Recurring anticyclones (areas of high pressure) dominated the month.



A very sunny month, thanks to the anticyclones: 178 hours, which is 60 percent above average for our area and 96 more hours than last year's total. There were only two days when no sunshine was recorded.
