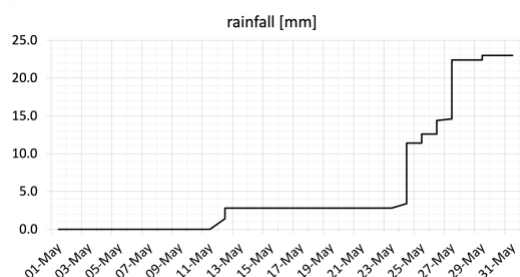
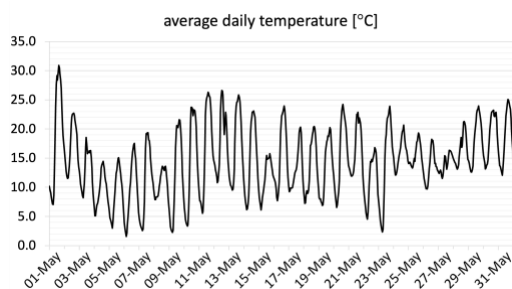


OffWeather – May 2025

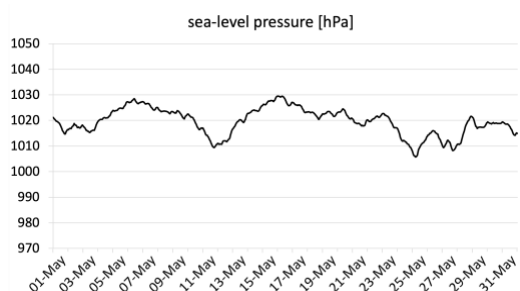
May was generally a drier month than normal just with 23 mm of rainfall, which is only 40 percent of the average for our area. Moreover, with March and April also being dry months this year's meteorological spring (March to May inclusive) turned out to be the third driest in our area over the past 27 years.



The average temperature was 14.5°C, which is 2.0°C above the area's average and 0.6°C above that of last May. There were 0 air frost(s) and 7 ground frost(s). The first saw the highest temperature of the month at 31.5°C, although this is an unofficial reading as my weather station is not approved to Met Office standards. Bablake Weather Services in Coventry, who have a Met Office approved weather station site and equipment, reported a maximum temperature of 26.5°C for that day, which was still the highest temperature for the month at their site.



Winds were mostly light northeasterlies turning southwesterly later with a max gust of 25 mph on the 29th. The sea-level atmospheric pressure for this month averaged 1020 hPa. The maximum pressure measured was 1030 hPa with a minimum of 1006 hPa.



It was another very sunny month with 212 hours of sunshine, which is ten percent above average for the area and 60 more hours than last year's total. There was only one day when no sunshine was recorded.
